COLLEGE PROFILE

1. ABOUT COLLEGE

"Government Degree College Ramnagar," is UGC Recognised under section 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act 1956, NAAC accredited and affiliated with the University of Jammu. It is located at a distance of about 40 kms from District Headquarters Udhampur of Jammu and Kashmir (UT) India. The College is located in village Thaplal which is about 3.5 kms from the Ramnagar town. The College campus is surrounded by hillocks is an idyllic spot spread over an area of about 36 acres of land presenting picturesque view that provides a quiet and serene environment and contemplation. It would be pertinent to mention that Ramnagar finds an important place on the historic map of State for 02 historical monuments; Sheesh mahal, a palace built by Raja Ram Singh in 1885. Another historic building near Sheesh Mahal is Ramnagar Fort overlooking Mansa Devi nallah. These are protected monuments taken over by Archaeological survey of India.

The College was established in 2005 to provide access to higher education to students of this tehsil particularly of far flung areas. College has a sprawling campus spread in 50 acres with picturesque landscapes, lush greenery and panoramic views of the surrounding hills. It has a vibrant and diverse student community, from various backgrounds and regions. The college aims to provide quality education, promote academic excellence and foster overall development among its students. It offers a range of co-curricular and extracurricular activities, including sports, cultural events and student societies to provide a holistic learning experience. The college offers a wide range of academic programs at the undergraduate levels. These programs cover a diverse array of subjects, including humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, commerce, management and applied sciences. The college provides facilities such as library, laboratories, Gym Facilities, Girl hostel and student support services to cater to the needs of its students. College has multiple classrooms equipped with desks, chairs, whiteboards, interactive panels and other latest modern necessary teaching aids. Girls Hostel typically has rooms with basic amenities such as study areas, dining halls and facilities for student's comfort and convenience. College has a dedicated browsing centre which is equipped with computers, printers, internet facility and other technological resources. Environmental friendly initiatives such as waste management and rain water harvesting in college is playing a significant role in promoting sustainability and raising awareness about environmental issues among students.

The institution has well qualified professionals who are responsible for teaching and guiding students in their academic pursuits. 3. INFRASTRUCTURE

3.1. CLASSROOMS

This institution has 14 spacious class rooms (out of which 09 are smart rooms) with proper seating arrangement and proper lightning system. Most of the rooms are also connected with CCTV cameras.



3.2. LABORATORIES

The College has 08 well equipped laboratories, one each in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Computer Applications, Geology, Psychology and Music departments. The new labs for Geology and Psychology will be operational from current session which are well designed with latest techniques as per the requirement of the practical's to be performed by the students in these labs.



3.3. LIBRARY

The College Library has a collection of about 14,000 books, comprising of reference, text, general, science refreshers, encyclopaedias and competitive exam books. One well-furnished reading room with computers and internet facility is available for the benefit of students of the College. Besides the College has also subscribed magazines, newspapers and journals which are available in the library. This is proper to mention that the College Library is fully atomized.



3.4. BOTANICAL GARDEN

The College has come up with various varieties and species of medicinal and local plants which have been properly tagged with scientific names and their uses. The botanical garden has quite scope for future expansion.

3.5. SEMINAR AND CONFERENCE HALLS

The College has 01 well-furnished seminar hall which can accommodate more than 100 audiences. Besides the College has also one conference hall with proper sound system and interactive panels. The College organizes conferences/ workshops/ seminars and other student oriented activities in these halls.



3.6. BROWSING CENTRE

The college has well equipped browsing centre for the use of students and faculty. The centre has been installed with 40 no. of computers with latest configuration and high speed (300 Mbps) internet. During the vacant classes the students utilize their time in the browsing centre and are also trained by the computer knowing faculty. Special 2 weeks computer training programmes are arranged to equip the students with computer skills.



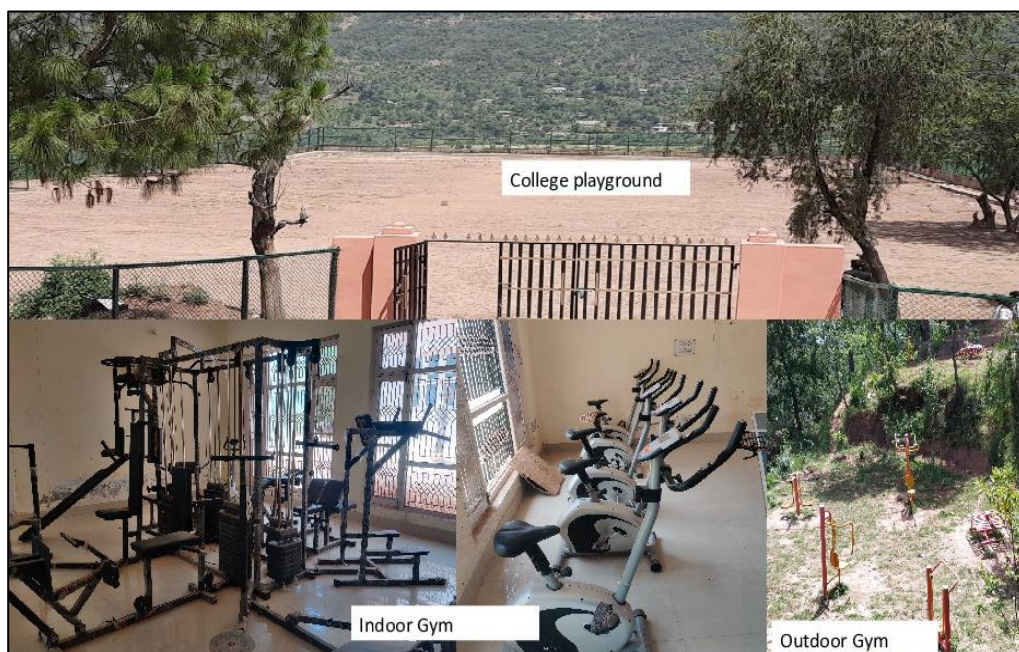
3.7. SPORTS:

The college has one large playground where students play the games of their interest. Besides the college has also basketball and kabaddi grounds. It is worth to mention that the students of this institution have tremendous talent in sports and bring laurels to institution during inter-district and inter-college championships held every year in Jammu University. Many of our players who excel in the above tournaments are usually selected to participate in the north-zone championship.

The College has also indoor and outdoor well equipped gym facilities for the students.



3.8. NSS (National Service Scheme)

The College has one NSS unit of 100 volunteers. The unit carries out its activities under the guidance of NSS Programme officer. After the admissions, the College notifies for the students who are interested to join as NSS volunteer. Every enrolled NSS volunteer is required to put in at least 120 hours of social work and attend one camp of 10 days duration during winter break in one session. The eligible candidates receive the NSS certificate. The NSS volunteers also participate in special/ National Integration camps held in various states of the country through directorate of NSS University of Jammu. The NSS volunteers who receive/ participate in NIC camps, YEP, RD camp New Delhi, selected as Best NSS volunteer or for other specified medals/ achievements gets the benefit in PG admissions in various Indian universities.



3.9. NCC (National Cadet Corps)

The College has one vibrant NCC unit which build the patriotic character to prepare them to join the defence/ armed forces to serve the nation. The unit also organize various activities to motivate the students to join the prestigious armed forces which ensures the unity and integration of the nation. Besides this the NCC makes the students disciplined and also develop the leadership qualities which contributes to a healthy society.



3.10. WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL

The College has a Women Development Cell which organizes various activities and interactive sessions regarding the women empowerment. Besides various awareness programmes are also held where the women achievers are invited to motivate the girl students to excel in various fields of their interest so that they can have financial and social independence. 3.12. COLLEGE HOSTEL

The College has come up with 50 bedded girls hostel which is situated adjacent to the administrative block within the college boundary. The hostel will be made operational from the current session. The rooms are well furnished and equipped with basic amenities required for the students. Notification will be issued after completion of the 1st phase of the admission to the semester 1st/ 3rd/ 5th. Preference will be given to Semester 5th and Semester 3rd students. The hostel facilities and discipline is supervised by the constituted Hostel committee.



3.13. CAREER COUNSELLING CELL

The College has also Career counselling cell which organize various programmes regarding the career options in various fields. They are also offered guidance to pursue higher studies, employment, trainings etc. Various programmes are organized for the students of the College by inviting the entrepreneur to motivate them for start-ups, to establish own business units so that they can become job givers instead of job seekers.

3.14. STUDENT GRIEVANCES CELL

The students of the College can project their grievance through the constituted Grievance cell. ADMISSIONS

1. Brief objectives of New Education Policy (NEP) 2020:

Govt. has implemented New Education Policy (NEP) since academic session 2022-23. The key highlights of the policy are as under:

- The four-year bachelor's course is to be preferred in various disciplines. Students who are mid-term dropouts would be given credit for their term they have completed and an option to complete their degree after the break.
- Colleges would no longer have an affiliation to the university. The deemed university status will also be ended. Over the next 15 years, the colleges would be given a graded autonomy to provide degrees.
- There is a proposal to cap the fees that are charged by private institutions with respect to higher education.
- Top-rated global universities in the world would be facilitated to come to India, as well as the top Indian institutes would be encouraged to go global.
- There is a proposal for flexible curriculum, creative combos of subjects, integrated vocational education at UG level. Students would also be allowed multiple entries and exit points at the UG level.
- The University grants commission would be replaced by the higher education commission of India.
- After a master's degree, there will be no MPhil degree prior to PhD. Students can

directly apply for PhD after their masters.

The policy envisages broad based, multi-disciplinary, holistic Under Graduate education with flexible curricula, creative combinations of subjects, integration of vocational education and multiple entry and exit points with appropriate certification. UG education can be of 3 or 4 years with multiple exit options and appropriate certification within this period. For example, Certificate after 1 year, Advanced Diploma after 2 years, Bachelor's Degree after 3 years and Bachelor's with Research after 4 years.

2. Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) under New Education Policy (NEP 2020)

Flexible UG Courses with Multiple Entries and Exits

As per the NEP, the students will now have options of multiple exits during their UG programme. For example, a student can exit just after 1st year of graduation with a certificate in hand. If he/she opts to exit after the second year, an Advanced Diploma will be awarded for 2 years of successful completion of study. As usual, the 3rd year of UG completion will result in a Bachelor's Degree and 4th year of UG completion will be awarded with a Bachelor's of Research/ Honours.

Credit plan of the Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) under National Education Policy (NEP 2020) as per University of Jammu Notification:

Note- Practical/Tutorials in science/other subjects (Major/Minor) are extension of the theory programme and is an inbuilt (3+1) credit course (i.e. 3 credits of theory and 1 credit of Practical/Tutorial except in 02 credits Major Courses of 5th Semester.

Further, the credits earned at various levels will get credited into a digitalized Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). Students can use their earned credits to take admission in another institution to further continue their studies for the remaining year/s of their graduation courses.

- The students can opt Minor course from the given combination.
- The Multi-Disciplinary (MD) course is to be chosen from the faculties other than that of the Major.
- The students pertaining to BCA degree cannot opt Computer Applications subject as minor or Multidisciplinary course.

- The students pertaining to BBA degree cannot opt for Management of Business Management or Marketing Management subject as minor or Multi-disciplinary course.
- Ability Enhancement (AE) Course: It may be a Modern Indian Language (MIL). MIL includes Hindi, Dogri, Urdu., English language (General).
- Skill Enhancement (SE) course: The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the University of Jammu.
- Value Added Courses (VAS): 04 compulsory courses are Understanding India, Environmental Science and Education, Digital Technologies, Health & Wellness.

NOTE: The college also offers admission to BCA/ BBA/ B. Com streams but the admission shall be subject to minimum strength of 25 students in each stream.

3.2 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO SEMESTER 1ST SESSION 2023-24

- A candidate to be eligible to admission to the 4 years UG programmes as per NEP-2020 must have passed the Hr. Secondary Part II examination (10+2 pattern) of Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education, CBSE, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.
- No candidate who wishes to enter a course of study prescribed by the University shall be admitted to Colleges unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination for admission to such course as prescribed under statutes.
- A candidate shall be deemed to be student of College as soon as he/she has been accepted for the enrolment by the Principal and has paid the prescribed fee for the course.
- The admission shall, however, be provisional unless regularized by the University.

No candidate whose result of Hr. Secondary part II examination has been modified after re-evaluation shall be admitted to Semester Ist of 4-years UG programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP 2020 after the expiry of last date of admission.

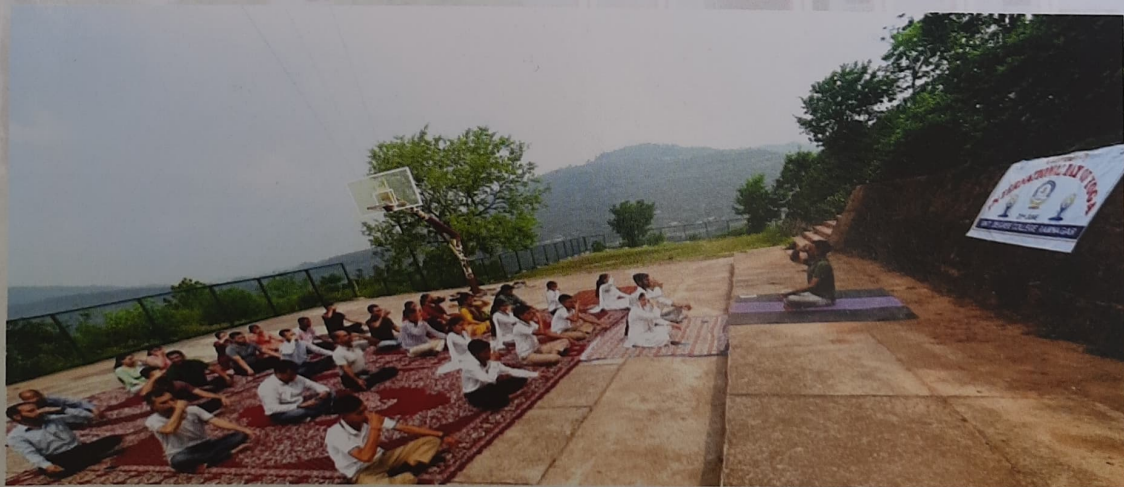
